Denmark is a predominantly Lutheran nation, Scotland, a predominantly Calvinist one, in terms of their respective Christian heritage. There are distinctive spiritual streams, but each in practice, incorporates other significant influences.

So in this year, marking 500 years since the Reformation, a group of Danes are coming – not as invaders, but ecumenical partners – to discuss with people from various Scottish churches matters pertaining to Church Music, Scripture and the practice of Baptism.

Participants can come for one, two or all three days. Lunch will be provided on Monday & Tuesday. Evening events/ entertainments are free to daily participants; they are open to those not attending during the day and tickets are available on the door.
